Health and Lifetime Fitness registration opens March 1st to accommodate potential MSDE changes to the high school graduation requirements for rising 9th graders. Parents should consult with their student's school counselor before registering to determine how the course(s) will fit with the student's academic plan.

Tuition: \$325.00 for Health OR Lifetime Fitness; \$550.00 for BOTH. Students may enroll in Health AND/OR Lifetime Fitness in the Blended Digital or Face-to-Face format. Each course is 0.5 credits and meets for 3 weeks.

Digital Courses

The Summer Program offers two types of digital education courses:

Blended Courses: Blended courses offer a combination of in-class and

online coursework. These courses are teacher facilitated and are designed for students who are independent, competent readers and motivated to learn in alternative formats. Classes meet face-to-face three days per week.

Fully Online Courses: Fully online courses allow students to access their coursework outside of the traditional school day and from any location. Courses are not scheduled in real time and most communication with the online teacher occurs through email, phone, or web conferencing.

All digital courses require that:

- **Students have reliable access to a computer and Internet connection outside of the classroom.**
- Students complete extensive online coursework outside of the scheduled class period.

Gear Up Program for Rising 9th Grade

Dates: June 24 – August 2
7:30am – 12:15pm
Site: Hammond HS

Current 8th grade students performing below grade level may enroll in the Gear Up Program with counselor recommendation. The Foundations of English and Foundations of Algebra courses are 0.5 credit electives designed to prepare students for high school coursework. Transportation is provided.

Early Summer School Credit Recovery

Dates: June 24-Jul 19, 1:30pm – 4pm
Tuition: \$50
Site: Atholton HS

The Early Summer School Credit Recovery program is intended for students who have failed three marking periods in a 2018-2019 academic school year course and are unable to earn credit. This program provides an opportunity

for students to get back on track; including the option for a second summer course if needed.

Students enrolling in credit recovery during Marking Period 4 will have an opportunity for their work to count towards credit while receiving additional time for remediation. Students are required to complete the first half of the course (Semester 1) during Marking Period 4 **at the home school site** by June 17th and will finish the second half of the course (Semester 2) during the first four weeks of Comprehensive Summer School (CSS).

Students who do not complete the first half of the course (Semester 1) during Marking Period 4 **at the home school site** by June 17th will be withdrawn and given a W grade.

Registering for Summer School

Instead of a single registration start date, there are now **two registration start windows**: February and March. English, math, science, and social studies courses will be available for registration in February. All other courses will be available to register beginning in March.

Registration requests **can be submitted online between the 1st-15th of each month** (Feb-June) through the Synergy Parent Portal. To register:

1. Go to HCPSS Connect Parent website and login
2. Select Innovative Pathways option on the left panel
3. Select the Parent Course Request QRC for directions (if needed) on how to register
4. Select Innovative Pathways course request
5. Select the **Summer Program** term (**NOT** Evening Program)
6. Select the course(s) and submit the request.

Registration requests do not guarantee enrollment in a course. Final enrollment status

will be communicated once the course schedule is complete.

Scheduling letters with information about the program and student's course(s), tuition, and balances will be mailed at the end of the month in which the student registers.

Submitting Payment

An initial payment of at least 25% of the total course cost is due by the 15th of the month in which the student registers with full payment due the following month. Partial payment is available for both mail-in and online payments.

Mail-in Payments: Send completed payment form (on Synergy Parent Portal registration site) and check (made payable to HCPSS) to the Innovative Pathways Office.

Online Credit Card Payments: Credit card payments (MasterCard/VISA) can be made online. Directions for online payments are located on the Synergy Parent Portal registration site.

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On-Site Registrations and Payments: Students needing assistance completing the registration form or wishing to drop off payments may attend any on-site registration at the Homewood Center. **Payments will NOT BE accepted at the HCPSS Central Office building.**

Financial Assistance

Students currently receiving Free And Reduced-priced Meals (FARMS) through HCPSS **automatically qualify for 50% tuition reduction** and do not have to submit documentation of that status.

Additionally, any family of an HCPSS student may apply for financial assistance by completing this form and providing documentation, including:

- Students who receive FARMS but require financial assistance beyond the 50% reduction
- Students who do not receive FARMS but require financial assistance

Students who are in temporary housing or homeless **do not need to complete this form**, but should contact their home school's Pupil Personnel Worker (PPW) and request submission of a SITH waiver to the Innovative Pathways

Program office.

Due to the already reduced cost of tuition, **no financial assistance is offered to students enrolling in a credit recovery course.**

Course Wait Lists

Space in courses is **limited**. Students who are not placed in a course will be automatically placed on the course waitlist. Students on the waitlist (regardless of circumstance or graduation status) are **not** guaranteed enrollment into the class. Should space become available, students on the waitlist will be contacted directly **VIA EMAIL**.

Withdrawals and Refunds

To withdrawal from a course:

1. Go to HCPSS Connect Parent website and login
2. Select Innovative Pathways option on the left panel
3. Select Course Withdrawal
4. Complete and submit the withdrawal form

Submitting the withdrawal form is final. There is no guarantee the student will be able to re-enroll in the course. Students must withdraw prior to the first day of their course to receive a full refund. Partial refunds may be issued up to July 2nd. Refunds will be processed within 4-6 weeks.

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
